


Class: Earthwork

This large bank, located in forestry near Park Burn, may indicate the remains of an unrecorded later Iron Age settlement.








Class: Settlement

Half in improved fields, half buried by rig and furrow agriculture, this wide circular bank may be the remains of a prehistoric fort.






Class: Structures, field system

Description:

Although partly recorded in the 20th century, this series of rectangular structures is undated and, like its associated field system, could be prehistoric or medieval.


Class: Farmstead; Settlement

Description:

The historic farmstead at Blue House overlies a series of banks and enclosures that could be much earlier in origin. This site has potential for prehistoric, medieval and postmedieval remains.






Class: Pit alignment

There are many pit alignments in SE Scotland, but it is rare for one to survive with associated upcast mounds. This site is puzzling and could potentially be anything from a prehistoric pitfall trap to mining or quarrying. Excavation would help us find out!






Class: Settlement (possible)

A new enclosure on Bunkle ridge may be a late Iron Age settlement. What was its relationship to the many forts along Bunkle, Preston and Marygold?






Class: Settlement

Very little is known about this enclosure at the west end of the Bunkle ridge. It could be Iron Age in date, like the other forts in the area.








Class: Building

Nothing is known about this unusual long rectangular building. There are a small number of similar sites in the area, but we know very little about their date or function.








Class: Building

Like site 9, this building is very unusual in form, and we know nothing about its date or purpose. It could date to the medieval period.






Class: Cairn (possible)

Above Whiteadder reservoir in forestry, these lumps and bumps may indicate the presence of a prehistoric cairn, perhaps overlain by later buildings.








