


## GAVINTON, FOGO & POLWARTH COMMUNITY COUNCIL

	There were no transactions since the last meeting on 7 <sup>th</sup> November 2022  • Balance of the CC account is £1227.91 of which General funds £1075.10  Covid 19 support funds £152.81	
	AS reported that an invoice for the insurance renewal due in February, received from SBC, for £124 compared to £17 previously was being investigated following Cllr Rowley's intervention. An email dated 6 December had been received from SBC to say that there are inconsistencies and that no invoices would be issued until these were clarified.	MR/AS

	a) Update on the problem of overhanging shrubbery in	
	Gavinton.  BW reported that no warning letter had been sent and, although some overhanging shrubbery had been cut back, it was still not sufficient. AS to contact Cllr Greenwell.	AS
	b) Resilient Community – purchase of supplies for if/when an electricity outage occurs	
	It was agreed that supplies of tea, coffee, hot chocolate, milk, squash and cup a soup should be sourced/purchased. Where possible, donations should be explored. CW had advised that supplies could be funded from the COVID fund. It was also suggested that a number of emergency foil thermal wraps be obtained. NG advised that Longformacus and Westruther had small generators. Gavinton has a large one. An enquiry to be made regarding Fogo's generator.	MN/AS
	c) Vehicle Speed/Abandoned Vehicles – Main St Gavinton Both abandoned cars have been removed. This can now be removed from the agenda. AS to advise Cllr Greenwell.	AS
	AS has been in contact with Philippa Gilhooly of SBC regarding the speed sign and been advised that Gavinton is on the priority list for replacement. AS to follow up with Cllr Greenwell on the speed tubes.	
	d) Renewal of the sign for the Ann Smith Memorial	
	NG offered to repaint the sign. He referred to the GFPCC minutes in April 2001 which noted a donation had been made to repair the sign and subsequently part of the funds had been used to surround the memorial with gravel. He suggested a Spring clear up job. AS suggested that as access to the memorial was quite difficult it might be moved closer to the Main Road. AS to investigate. It was noted that Lady Ann Pringle of Langton House had arranged the installation of the memorial for Ann Smith who had been a family retainer for 40 years	AS
	e) Glass Recycling in Gavinton	
	NG suggested a possible site near to the Church Hall. There are several issues including noise, parking, and mess e.g., the site in the Duns Industrial Area. It was agreed this item be carried forward to the next meeting when comment can be heard from a Cllr.

	Gavinton. BW had previously met a representative from SBC and shown him the location of the knotweed, but he has heard nothing further. Cllr Rowley had sent through a link to the Tweed Forum. AS to forward to BW.	AS/BW

	AS is following up on the plans for the park. Recent update from Craig Blackie - delays in tendering for a contractor mean that plans for the playpark are not yet available. The contract is going out to tender early December with the hope of appointing a contractor early in the new year. Once the company carrying out the work is identified he will request that the plans be shared with the CC as soon as possible.	KD
	<ul> <li>e) Gavinton Full Fibre Broadband Project         AS advised that the Village Hall Committee has decided to         stream movies and live events and are seeking funding to do         this but, in the meantime, have approached Go Fibre asking if         the company would be prepared to connect the Hall as part of         its broadband rollout. 	f) Maintenance of road edges. JG/MR urged CC members and residents to photograph potholes and upload to SBC 'report a pothole' online service – these reports go straight on to the SBC list of planned works and can trigger a road inspection where multiple reports are made of road issues.	
10	Issue of new notice board at Fogo Church Historic Scotland had inspected the site and suggested that the notice board be moved further away from the historic lychgate.	MR

11	Proposal to develop Lees Hill Renewable Energy Park AS had contacted the developers to ascertain the next steps for the project. A reply was received from Julie Aitken who is now the Senior Project Manager. With the comments from the public and the findings of their environment and technical studies an updated layout will be prepared and submitted for further public consultation in a series of meetings and exhibitions before a formal planning application is submitted. 12	Hardens Hill Quarry  Mrs Huggins-Haig has written three letters to SEPA, the government body responsible for the safe policing of the site, on this issue and has not received a reply. It was suggested that TH-H write again, with the previous correspondence, advising them of the next CC meeting and cc JG/DM/MR. It appears from his enquiries that the quarry has a historic license which allows the use of the quarry when necessary e.g. road building, or if the windfarm gets the go ahead. ## 16 **Councillor Update**

None of the Councillors were able to attend the meeting. Cllr Rowley sent an email dealing with three issues.

Duns Nursery: a local group are making progress putting a business plan together to take over the nursery on a community ownership model. Any support would be welcome.

The SBC budget would be coming out in the next day or two. The Councillors are aiming to agree a cross party budget recognising that it will be the hardest budget in a decade with the pay awards, no likely increases in funding and massive inflation having effects. SBC would like to hear rural communities' priorities come through.

Finally, there was a council proposal to support Duns Swimming Pool reduce its carbon emissions, become more sustainable and help it cut energy costs substantially.

There were no updates from Cllr Moffat or Cllr Greenwell
